In these times of upheaval and great loss, many of us ask ourselves: What is my part to play? How do we respond faithfully? How does a person choose where to direct limited energy and caring, when there's so much happening and so many ways and places to engage? If you'd welcome the opportunity to participate in a small group of people paying attention to where they feel most strongly drawn by the love of God, consider joining one of three online groups starting on September 27th. **Samantha E. Lioi, Mennonite spiritual director, writer, and retreat leader, will facilitate Trusting the Voice of Love: Discerning Inner Wisdom**, a 5-week online spiritual formation group designed to nurture trust in God and among each other. The groups will run once a week from Sept 27- Oct 25 with options in the morning, evening, and afternoon. This group will include:

- silence in centering prayer teaching on discernment in the Ignatian tradition
- sharing and listening with others in the group
- guided, embodied prayer and inward listening practices
- time for reflection and journaling
- opportunities to become more aware of how the Divine is drawing you, what is yours to do, and what might be distractions along the way

Mennonite Central Committee response to Haiti earthquake: Families who have already suffered so much have been hit once again. On Saturday, August 14th, a 7.2 magnitude earthquake hit the country, killing at least 1,300 people and injuring thousands more. Early reports show that many of those who survived lost their homes. Thousands are sleeping outside, with little food and no protection from the elements. Right now, local partners are assessing the situation to provide aid where needed most.
