Our Mission Offering for April is the Highland Health Clinic. You will be hearing more about this work. It provides free *medical* and pharmaceutical care to uninsured people across the greater *Johnstown* region.

We will have a Good Friday Service on Fri., April 15 at 7:00 pm. This service will include communion and foot washing. If you would like to participate in a 4 person Reader's Theater or scripture reading, please let Jayne know.

We will have an Easter Sunday Outdoor Sunrise Service at the Hunsberger farm (687 E Campus Ave, Davidsville) at 6:00 am followed by a breakfast. (Note new starting time due to the sun rising earlier than we thought!) Stay tuned for more details! We will also have our regular worship service at 10:30 am at the church.

Over the past month, we have borne witness to a heartbreaking refugee crisis in Ukraine. According to the United Nations, there are over 26 million refugees throughout the world who have been forced to flee their communities. Less than 1% will find safety in the U.S., but for the families accepted into the U.S. resettlement program, the journey does not end when they arrive in their new communities. You are invited to join MCC and Church World Service on Tuesday, April 12, at 2:00 pm EDT for a webinar to learn more about how to welcome refugees in your community. During this time, we'll address questions such as:

- Who are refugees?
- How do refugees come to the U.S.?
- What does the refugee resettlement process look like?
- What are some challenges and opportunities refugees encounter when they settle into their new community?
- What are some ways each of us can get involved and support refugees in the U.S.
